Pupil Premium School Funding - Thank you to those who have already responded to our email requesting help to secure additional Pupil Premium school funding for children who are eligible for Free School Meals. Through this recent check, we have identified 3 children who we can claim additional funding for. This Government grant is allocated to schools to spend in any way to support raising the attainment for the most vulnerable pupils. We are asking all low-income families to complete a guick eligibility check.

School Uniform

Due to space limitations and the risk of trip hazards, children can only bring to school a slim-line book bag or a drawstring bag (both available to purchase through the T2P app) that can fit into their personal learning tray. Rucksacks have never been permitted due their size and bulk - a drawstring bag can hold a packed lunch and home learning whilst being worn like a rucksack.

Site Information

To avoid confusion, the one-way system should be used at all times when dropping off and collecting children to/from their classrooms. New Attendance Rules!

There are new rules for unauthorised absences, whether this is due to holiday, irregular attendance, or otherwise. Don't get caught out!



I'm a single parent of one child and we want to go on holiday for 5 days.

Make sure you use the absence request form before you book anything. Your holiday will not be authorised. As your child will miss 5 school days, you'll be given a penalty notice fine. See section 2, too!

1 parent & 1 child = £160

Reduced to £80 if paid in 21 days

For each child a penalty is given...









1 parent & 4 children = £640

Reduced to £320 if paid in 21 days

For a family of 2 parents & 4 children

£1280
Reduced to £640 if paid in 21 days

What happens if school suspects children are actually on holiday?

Photos on Facebook?
Foreign mobile dial tone?
Other children talking
about your holiday?
Amazing sun tan?
Home visit shows no-one
at home?

Please don't be offended if we ask for evidence or mention these questions to you. We're required to do this to ensure a fair system!



What about subsequent absences? Is it still the same penalty amount?

No, not anymore. If in any period of not more than 3 years, your child has a 2nd and 3rd leave of absence OR pattern of irregular attendance, which

is unauthorised, then...

2nd TIME e.g. 1 parent and... 1 child = £160

2 children = £320 3 children = £480

NO DISCOUNT FOR EARLY PAYMENT

4 children = £640

3rd TIME

A penalty notice fine will not be given. Instead, your case may be taken to court. A magistrate can fine each parent £2,500 for each child.

1 parent & 4 children = £10,000 2 parents and 4 children = £20,000



What about irregular attendance? Could I get a penalty notice?





notice. Remember, 1 day is 2 sessions

(morning and afternoon).

If your child is absent for 10 or more sessions in 10 weeks, and their absences are unauthorised, then the school is required to consider penalty notices / prosecution.



What are typical reasons given that won't be authorised?

Examples of unauthorised absences

A family member's birthday Shopping for uniforms Inadequate clothing for school Child being used as a carer Problems with transport Sickness of parent or sibling Sibling's school closed Refusing to attend, but able to Poor family organisation Family holidays No absence request completed Where attendance is irregular, or historically poor, sickness absences may be unauthorised unless medical confirmation by a medical professional is given.



Hampshire County Council use the income generated from the fines to take legal action against those who do not pay the fine or repeat offenders, the school never receives any of this money.

We are in the process of updating our Attendance Policy to ensure it reflects current guidance.

Child and Family Support Worker

A warm welcome to our QI families, from our Child & Family Support Worker – Carla Farrell. Each monthly newsletter will include a section on a specific topic which we hope will be both informative and helpful. This month, it's all about the importance of routines and looking specifically at how to create a morning routine for you and your child to make those transitions from home to school a little easier.

It's important to recognise that children mirror our emotions and behaviours. If we as adults are stressed, unorganised and struggling to get out of the house, do not be surprised if they are too. In setting morning routines, we have to lead by example.

Here are a few top tips to help:

- Having an age appropriate and healthy bedtime routine is a must.
 Without this the following morning may be a struggle.
- Plan and prepare for the morning the night before.

Do packed lunches need to be made? Have their school dinners been ordered? Ask your child to have their bookbag and shoes ready by the front door. Have their uniform/PE kit ready. Do they have after school clubs to get ready for?

• Set alarm clocks.

If those times are not working and you're feeling pushed for time, adjust it 5 minutes or so earlier until you find a time that works for you all. Leave yourself plenty of time to get to school to avoid the last-minute panic.

Use 'morning routine' visual aids to get your child involved.

There are various styles of visual aids that may help your child in the morning such as checklists, now and next boards, flipcharts. Children feel more confident and secure when things are predictable and familiar so being able to see what is expected of them can help. You can also involve them in making routine boards and ticking off checklists.

Try to remain calm and enjoy your mornings together.
 Remember that children will feed off of the atmosphere created and your emotions.
